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
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My career path



Temporary lectureship one: 5 months

- Cover workload of a teaching-focussed colleague
- Opportunity to get teaching experience beyond demonstrating
 - Thoughts at time: Good for the CV, desire to be a "well-rounded" academic
- Loved it
 - Return to microbiology as a field, rather than a focussed sub-section
 - Recognition/gratitude from students

- The push for independence
 - Lab work
 - Papers

 - Burnout
 - Did not want to do research

Didn't seek any support "Career paralysis"

Temporary lectureship two: 7 months


Teaching fellow one: 2 years

- Was extremely lucky
 - Early retirement of a colleague \rightarrow teaching contract
 - Relief → imposter syndrome
- Started to seek advice
 - "Hope for the best, plan for the worst"
 - Do you have a plan/strategy if your contract isn't renewed?
 - Focus on things that are the most impactful
 - Be realistic, and say "no" sometimes!



Novelty graduation poses = highly recommended!







Teaching fellow one: 2 years
