1.1 About us

The Society launched a fundraising initiative in May 2021, the Unlocking Potential (UP) fund. The appeal will generate funds to underwrite a new bespoke grant which will make funds available for members who may require an extra level of support to help them resolve an issue or deal with a situation that threatens to hold them back from achieving their potential.

1.2 About you

You will have experience of co-ordinating fundraising activities and supporting individual appeal programmes to wider audiences too. You will be a self-starter used to working independently but with the support of colleagues able to implement opportunities developed by the Fundraising Working Group. You will be comfortable working with a wide range of people from diverse backgrounds including research, academia and industry sectors. You will support the Society with activities to strengthen and grow the Unlocking Potential Fund, working with managers and key staff across all teams as well as our members who hold positions on our Council, Committees, and Divisions.

1.3 Duties

- Implement activities to maximise donations and improve the fundraising platform; engage members and other stakeholders with giving; and raise the profile of the Unlocking Potential Fund.
- Working closely with communication and membership team colleagues, support with fundraising communications by commissioning/writing targeted appeal mailings; producing/commissioning suitable content for our website, social media channels and member magazine. You will also create case studies of successes and communicating these widely across the Society's channels.

- Proactively contact, cultivate and invite members and other stakeholders to support the Unlocking Potential campaign and support participating members to ensure they remain connected, valued and thanked appropriately.
- Working closely with the professional development team, develop and implement the Unlocking Potential Grant, by which members will benefit from the proceeds of the Unlocking Potential Fund.
- Report progress on a regular basis to the senior management team, the Fundraising Working Group and Council.

- Good general understanding of fundraising within the charity sector and a working knowledge of GDPR legislation.
- Highly developed interpersonal skills, with the ability to deal comfortably with key individuals at all levels and collaborate well with team members.
